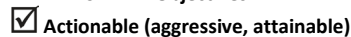

Objective 4.7: By June 2024, promote ongoing takeback locations and drug disposal programs.	Baseline: 0 outreach sent about ongoing takebacks Target: QR code info link placed on all Montgomery County water bills and other promotional mail	1. Generate a QR code linked to on-going take back opportunities and drug disposal methods such as the new drug disposal pouches. 2. Contact the county about incorporating a QR code for medication take-back into the county and other jurisdiction water bills.	Start: Jan 2024 End: June 2024	Subcommittee for safe med use
