Situational Status Report

Community Overdose Action Team (COAT)

1. Situation to date

- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **290*** accidental overdose deaths in 2019 (*data October-December still preliminary).
- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there have been **2*** accidental overdose deaths as of January 2, 2020 (*January data still preliminary).
- The COAT has secured a contractor to conduct evaluation of the coalition and to facilitate a strategic planning process.
- The COAT was selected to present a Quick Hit Session at the 2020 NACCHO Preparedness Summit in Dallas, Texas. The session will be: "*Community Overdose Action Team: An Innovative Approach Using the Incident Command System to Combat the Drug Crisis in Montgomery County, Ohio.*"
- Operational period currently stands at 60 days.
