Situational Status Report

Community Overdose Action Team (COAT)

1. Situation to date

- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **285** accidental overdose deaths in 2019.
- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there have been **101*** accidental overdose deaths in 2020 as of April 30, 2020 (*February – April data still preliminary).
- Our community is in the height of a global pandemic. The Governor and Director of Health placed orders for many businesses to cease and/or limit operations until further notice and continue to promote social distancing for residents to prevent spread of the disease. We have been monitoring the ramifications of the COVID-19 pandemic on behavioral health and continue to do so. COAT hosted virtual meetings in the month of April and will continue hosting virtual meetings until further notice.
- The COAT issued multiple Situation Reports as a result of EpiCenter anomalies on the following dates:
 - March 21, 2020
 - April 12, 2020
 - April 20, 2020
 - April 30, 2020

The COAT Backbone Support and Operations Section had a joint meeting on April 27, 2020 to discuss the current data, current program/service provision, and needs for additional programs/services in light of the COVID-19 pandemic.

- COAT, in collaboration with Montgomery County Prevention Coalition (MCPC), is in the process of finalizing the strategic plan for drug overdose prevention for Montgomery County. Draft action plans have been shared with the COAT branches for review and revision.
- Public Health – Dayton & Montgomery County has drug overdose prevention funding through the Ohio Department of Health. Additional funding was awarded to support ODMAP implementation through August 2020.
- All branches will continue meeting virtually until further notice.
- Operational period still stands at 60 days.
