Situational Status Report

Community Overdose Action Team (COAT)

Situation to date

- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there were **285** accidental overdose deaths in 2019.
- Per the Montgomery County Coroner's Office, there have been **290*** accidental overdose deaths in 2020 as of November 22, 2020 (*July-November data still preliminary).
- For January – October 2020, the preliminary total is 272 deaths. This is 18% higher than the same time period of 2019 (230).
- Our community is in the height of a global pandemic. The Governor and Director of Health continue placing orders that have modified our day to day processes (i.e. mask wearing, social distancing, etc.). We have been monitoring the ramifications of the COVID-19 pandemic on behavioral health and recognize the impact this has on those who struggle with the disease of addiction.
- The 2019 Poisoning Death Review Report and Overdose Fatality Review Addendum was recently finalized and will be available under “Data & Reports” on the COAT website (www.mccoat.org) and will also be emailed out to all COAT members.
- The COAT Education & Information Branch would like to welcome Tina Rezash-Rogal, Marketing/Public Affairs Manager at OneFifteen, as the new co-lead for the branch.
- The COAT issued multiple Situation Reports as a result of EpiCenter anomalies on the following dates:
 - September 22, 2020
 - October 12, 2020
 - November 4, 2020

7. Drug Supply Control

Drug Supply Control represent the work of our local task forces.

Drugs seized by law enforcement provide a snapshot of drugs present in the community.

Montgomery County has three task forces working to remove unwanted drugs from our streets:

- Miami Valley Bulk Smuggling Task Force - includes six agencies that conduct criminal investigations utilizing their investigative authority to protect the citizens of the Miami Valley by disrupting and dismantling international drug trafficking organizations.
- Regional Agencies Narcotics and Gun Enforcement (R.A.N.G.E) Task Force - includes twelve law enforcement agencies in Montgomery County and works to combat drug abuse and trafficking.
